## **REPORT OF THE EABIC MISSION AT THE DEPARTMENT OF THE INTER AMERICAN SYSTEM OF HUMAN RIGTHS, OF THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS OF THE CHILEAN GOVERNMENT.**

The delegation of the EABIC, conformed by Hon. Priest Rodrigo Calderón, Hon Prophet Cristián Vásquez and Hon Prophet Aler Neira, went to the Office of the Inter American System of Human Rights of the government of Chile to an intierview with the Chief of such International Office, Mr. Luis Petit-Laurent.

These Royal interview took place in the Office of Mr. Petit at Monday 25 of April 2010, during the time of celebration of the 45º Anniversary of the King of kings down to Egypt/ Jamaica and the fullfiment of all prophecy and history, give thanks for the coming of our glorious King and the glad tidings of Rastafari in our Repatriation case, Holy Emmanuel I Selassie I Jah Rastafarl.

During these interview we can reason and exchange points of view with Mr. Petit about the Repatriation case of the EABIC in the Latin America and Diaspora in general, and also the situation of the African Diaspora in Latin America. The EABIC was looking to put it the case in the Agenda of OAE to be discusses in any of the upcoming General Assembly or Activities of such Organization, during these present Year of Afro Ascendant People.

The delegation present the EABIC Church and Governmant and his aim and objectives officially to these Office. Moreover we present documents relatives to our Congress agitation for these rights, and 17

pages Repatriation and 4 Point Agenda, and also Reports of the works of our Office worldwide and also in Chile at the UN Cepal Office, Azania (South Africa) Embassy.

Presented such documents, Mr. Petit can have a insight focus of our operations and we open a dialogue about the issue of Repatriation and how the Congress have been working these principles through Human Rights.

We inform Mr Petit- Laurent that our Government is demanding 7, 9 or 13 miles of High Water Ships to return Black people from the Diaspora back to Africa, without any migration program, or visa and passport requirements. These ships and Compensation must come from such nation that have been held as responsible for the genocide of the slave trade, as England, Spain, Portugal just to name a few.

The Agenda for these reasoning was present officially our case to these Inter American Office, and seek for an advisory opinion of such Organization, and presented our case at Inter American Court of Human Rights of the OAE for an International Dialogue in the Continent.

The right of International Repatriation and Reparation to the Black people in the Diaspora under the UDHR and all other relevant Instrument of International Law and Human Rights is a viable solution for those portion of the African descendant in the West that wanted nothing more than Repatriation, as the way to pay Reparation and Compensation for the damage caused to the Black Nation.

Mr Petit say to us that he found that our rights and petitions were worthy to be presented and very tangible in the legal aspect, and also that the Repatriation case could be a good topic in the OAE during the Year of the Afro Ascendant, because is necessary show to the world the present reality that the Black people live in Latin America, in countries like Brazil, Colombia, Ecuador just to name a few, and the new forms of slavery, discrimination and racism that are still inflicted upon the Black people.

These topic need to be discuss urgently to give a legal solution and recognition of self-determination and development in Africa, as Marcus Garvey taught us "Africa for the African those at home and us abroad", Holy Marcus I Selassie I Jah Rastafar!

The thematic of the Year of Afro Ascendant is looking Recognition, Justice and Development of the People of African Ascendant worldwide, so Repatriation Back to Africa, without visa, passport or migration program are viable and tangible solution for the few percent of the whole of the African Diaspora who freely wanted to go back to his Mother Land and settle there.

He (Mr Petit) ask if we the EABIC is still register in UN ECOSOC . We tell him that our Congress was register at 1967 in the ECOSOC, as a non governmental organization that work through Human Rights the case of Freedom, Redemption and International Repatriation, but presently we dont have the NGO Consultive Status.

According to that, Mr Petit suggest us that it is very important to the EABIC make sure that our registration inside the ECOSOC as a NGO and get the Consultive Status is very important for the future development of our case, because following such diplomatic steps, I&I will be able to step forward and reach the global level that our rights need to be discuss.

According to our petition to put it our case in the OAS and presented it to the Inter American Court of Justice, Mr Petit-Laurent suggest us that our Congress, if the Congress is register as a NGO in any of the Member States, could make an Application to be part of the Organizations of Civil Society (OCS) of the OAE, and take part of the Conference and Activities that the OAS sponsored year by year and have a voice inside the Organization through Dialogue and Representations, specially in the human rights area and all the activities, Seminars or Presentation made in commemoration of the Afro Ascendant People.

These is the legal way that we have to reach to the Inter American Court of Justice and the OAS.

Mr Petit say us that Chile government always support the NGO`s that make Application for Participation in Civil Society, and eventually the EABIC, through the sponsorship of any Member State, could put the Repatriation case in the Agenda of the OAS and his relevants bodies.

In few words, the same steps that we have to make in ECOSOC, we have to do it in the OAS to push forward our case of Repatriation for the Africans in the Diaspora.

We give thanks for the God of Daniel moving among I&I to deliver our people out of the lion,s den, Daniel God Jah Rastafarl Selah Selassie I Jah Rastafarl.

We seal with 7 words of love: Negus is love, let us all love, Selassie I Jah Rastafarl.

## RELEVANT INFORMATION ABOUT REGISTRATION AT ORGANIZATION OF CIVIL SOCIETY IN THE OAS.

Since its foundation, the Organization of American States (OAS) has a long history of cooperation with national and international institutions in order to strengthen peace and security in the Hemisphere, consolidate democracy and promote economic, social and cultural development. In 1999, the OAS Permanent Council adopted the “Guidelines for the Participation of Civil Society Organizations in OAS Activities” that regulate the participation of non-state actors in the political bodies and in the decision-making process of the Organization so that the OAS could benefit from the significant contributions that CSOs can make to its work.

These Guidelines contained in document CP/RES. 759 (1217/99) establish the Registry of Civil Society Organizations in the OAS and allow CSOs to become part of a network of organizations that work in the different thematic areas of interest for the Member States of the Organization. The Registry facilitates the exchange of information and experiences that enrich the design of governmental policies through the organized participation and dialogue between CSOs, governments and inter-American and international organizations. There are currently 342 CSOs registered in the OAS.

Civil society organizations registered in the OAS can:

- Participate in public meetings of the Permanent Council, the Inter-American Council for Integral Development (CIDI), and their subsidiary bodies
- Provide input by means of written documents on questions thematically relevant to meetings of the Permanent Council or CIDI, preferably not to exceed 2,000 words (texts exceeding 2,000 words must be accompanied by executive summaries, which the General Secretariat shall distribute). Likewise, the CSO may give a presentation at the beginning of the deliberations, with prior approval from the relevant Committee of the Permanent Council or CIDI.
- Access draft resolutions and/or resolutions adopted by the General Assembly and authorization to comment on them
- Receive the resolutions adopted by the OAS General Assembly at its annual regular session
- With the Chair’s authorization, participate in closed meetings of the Permanent Council, CIDI and their political bodies
- Receipt of documents in advance of the meetings of the working groups or specialized groups of the Permanent Council or CIDI. With prior authorization, CSOs may make a statement and have it distributed to Member States in order to consider the issue
- Apply for funding from the Specific Fund to Support the Participation of Civil Society Organizations in OAS Activities and in the Summits of the Americas Process

How can CSOs participate in the activities of the Organization of American States (OAS)?

First, a civil society organization can register in the Organization of American States (OAS). Second, if a civil society organization would like to participate without registering, it can attend meetings of the General Assembly, the Permanent Council, the Inter-American Council for Integral Development (CIDI), and other specialized conferences of the OAS by requesting to attend as a Special Guest. The third way to participate in OAS activities is by signing cooperation agreements with the OAS General Secretariat in order to develop joint programs.

What benefits do CSOs receive from registration to the OAS?

- Present recommendations and assist in effectively implementing the OAS resolutions adopted at each session of the General Assembly, as appropriate.
- Receive the calendar of OAS meetings and, when possible, the themes to be discussed in the meetings.
- Designate representatives to participate in public meetings of the Permanent Council, CIDI and their subsidiary bodies.
- Access virtual consultations on issues and initiatives promoted by the OAS.
- Contribute to the elaboration of the agenda of an annual meeting of the Permanent Council on a matter of special interest to registered CSOs for a broad and substantive dialogue.
- Attend closed meetings of the Permanent Council, the CIDI, and other organs with authorization from the Chair of the meeting in question, in consultation with the participating Member State delegations.
- Receive documents in advance of the meetings of the Working Groups and Special Committees of the Permanent Council or the CIDI.
- Distribute written documents before meetings of the Committees of the Permanent Council or of the CIDI.
- Present written documents, not exceeding 2,000 words, on questions that fall within its particular sphere of competence and appear on the agenda or order of business for the meetings of the Permanent Council, CIDI and their Committees. These documents shall be distributed by the General Secretariat to Member States.
- Receive the OAS resolutions adopted at each session of the General Assembly.

CSOs seeking to be registered in the OAS and participate in the Organization's activities must comply with the "Guidelines for the Participation of CSOs in OAS Activities" approved by the Permanent Council in Resolution CP/RES. 759. Each civil society organization must send a letter to the OAS Secretary General indicating its interest in being considered for such status. The letter should be sent to:

The application must contain the following information:

1. Official name, address and date of establishment of the organization and the name(s) of its director(s) and legal representative(s).
2. Primary areas of activity and their relationship to the activities of the OAS organs, agencies, and entities in which it wishes to participate.
3. Reasons why the organization believes its proposed contributions to OAS activities would be of interest to the OAS.
4. Identification of the OAS work areas in which the organization proposes to support the ongoing activities of the OAS or to make recommendations on the best way to achieve OAS objectives.

Applications should include the following documentation:

- A duly notarized copy of the articles of incorporation, charter, or constitution;
- A duly notarized copy of the certificate of incorporation, if applicable;
- A duly notarized copy of the bylaws;
- A copy of the most recent annual report;
- Institutional mission statement signed by a director or the legal representative; and
- A copy of the financial statements for the previous fiscal year, including reference to public and private sources of financing, signed by the financial officer or the public accountant of the applicant organization.

How is the application letter handled once received?

Upon receiving the request to be registered in the OAS, the Secretary General will submit the application to the Department of International Affairs to review the letter, attached documents, and verify that all the requirements and supporting documents mentioned above have been included in the application.

If the application is complete, the Committee on Inter-American Summits Management and Civil Society Participation in OAS Activities (CISC) of the Permanent Council will make a recommendation on the organization's eligibility for registration. An organization may be required to provide additional information before the Committee can complete its review. If this is the case, the General Secretariat will notify the organization immediately.

The recommendations of the CISC will be presented to the Permanent Council to make a decision regarding the registration of the organization. If the Permanent Council decides to accept the request, the civil society organization will be notified and the name of the organization and its application will be added to the Registry of CSOs.

Are there any selection criteria to be registered to the OAS?

CSOs seeking registration must have:

- Recognized standing within its particular field of competence and must be of a representative nature.
- Institutional structure that includes appropriate mechanisms for holding its officers accountable and subject to its members.
- Legal representative and an executive officer, as well as an established headquarters.
- Resources obtained primarily from its affiliates or individual members.
- The institutional and financial structure should be transparent and afford the CSO a certain degree of independence.
- Headquarters or principal activities not located in any territory over which there exists a sovereignty dispute between an OAS Member State and a State outside the hemisphere.
- Geographic origin - The Committee seeks to ensure the registration of CSOs from all Member States, in order to facilitate just, balanced and effective participation by all regions of the hemisphere.

What are the responsibilities of CSOs after registering in the OAS?

- Answer inquiries from the organs, agencies and entities of the OAS and provide advisory services to them upon request.
- Disseminate information on OAS activities to its members.
- Present to the General Secretariat, before December 31st of each year, a report containing an executive summary on its participation in OAS activities during that year, its financial situation and sources of funding, and the activities planned for the coming year.
- Keep the information on its executive officers up-to-date.
